THE PASTOR'S PEN

In times like these, when immigrant children are separated from their parents with no guarantee that they will be reunited... In times like these, when people run the risk of being gunned down anywhere they go... In times like these, when LGBTQ people are denied services in the name of Christianity... In times like these, when women are victims of assault in a male-privilege world... In times like these, when people of color struggle to survive in a country enmeshed in systemic racism... In times like these, when Flint, Michigan, USA still has no drinkable water and Puerto Rico, USA is still without power...

In times like these, it's tempting to give up and give in to a sense of hopelessness. But we mustn't. God needs us now, more than ever before to be God's voice, God's hands, God's feet, God's very presence in the world.

It's not unusual to look to quotations from contemporary and historical heroes for encouragement. There's some relief in seeing your feelings of frustration, fear, and hopes put to words. That's probably why so many memes are shared on Facebook. But lately, I've found some relief in the Psalms because they also put into words the wide array of feelings that assault me in times like these.

When I am tired of waiting for justice, I find in the Psalms words for my feelings: "How long must I bear pain in my soul, and have sorrow in my heart all day long? How long shall my enemy be exalted over me?" (Psalm 13:2)

When I need words of hope and encouragement, I find them in the Psalms: "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea." (Psalm 46:1-2)

When I'm looking for an anthem of resistance, any psalm of praise will do, because with their lyrics, I am choosing joy, even in the face of injustice: "Every day I will bless you, and praise your name forever and ever. Great is Adonai, and greatly to be praised; God's greatness is unsearchable." (Psalm 145:2-3)

I give myself permission to replace words in the psalms to make them more personal and meaningful to me. "My enemies," then, sometimes are replaced with actual names. Mention of "kings" might be replaced with "the President." "Rulers" and "nations" become "politicians." In this way, the psalm is transformed into one for times like these.

If you haven't tried re-reading the psalms as if they were written for times like these,

you might give it a shot. They just might provide the relief you are looking for.

But whatever you do, remember to take a break from the headlines every once in a while (Luke 5:16); try not to fall into the trap of demonizing your opponent (Luke 6:27-28); and never forget that you are God's beloved child (Romans 8:38-39).

Since the *Masterpiece* decision earlier this month, the opponents of equality have been proclaiming victory, asserting that the Court handed them a big win. The decision has clearly emboldened anti-LGBTQ groups and their supporters, leaving LGBTQ Texans to wonder if it's open season for discrimination:

- Does the *Masterpiece* decision create a license to discriminate?
- If you're turned away for being gay or transgender, what can you do?
- Is it too late to stop anti-LGBTQ activists from passing more religious refusal laws targeting communities they don't like?
