### ***THE PASTOR'S PEN***

*This coming month will mark 50 years that Metropolitan Churches have been transforming lives and transforming the world. Each week's worship in October and the first week of November will be devoted to a separate decade of MCC's existence.*

**Sunday, October 7: The Open Table.** The first week's service is inspired from our first decade: 1968-1978. We gather around the table bringing all we are to our family of choice. We celebrate Christ who invites us to the table and accept the invitation with our fullest of selves. We don't all agree yet, we gather anyway to create a unique, messy, complicated family of believers who comfort and challenge one another. We celebrate the vision of MCC that began in a humble living room and spread throughout the world, as we consider new ways we are all called to invite more family members to the table.

**Sunday, October 14: Love.** The second week's service is inspired from our second decade: 1978-1988. We remember those who died of AIDS and others who fought to make the leaders of the world name and recognize the AIDS epidemic. We remember the individuals, particularly women, who decided to lead in love rather than fear. We grieve those we loved who were taken from the world. On that day, we wonder how to navigate without our mentors. We build urgency over the health of one's body. Even with improved medication and prevention, responsibility still needs to be exercised to prevent another epidemic. We give thanks and tremendous love for the courageous women who sacrificed and nurtured as they simultaneously fought for recognition and inclusion within MCC. We recognize the ongoing work that exists for gender equality and inclusive love around the world.

**Sunday, October 21: Justice.** The third week's service is inspired from our forth decade: 1988-1998. We confess that we have not loved with our whole hearts. We have been selfish in what we have done and what we have left undone. Though we have done great things to live into our call to "do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God," we have a great work do within the walls of our church and in our local and global communities. With God, we lament the world's greed and ways we have stayed silent in the face of oppression and injustice. We humbly ask for forgiveness from God, from one another, and from those we may never know. Throughout this service we will use water as a metaphor for confession, change, and forgiveness.

**Sunday, October 28: Hope.** The fourth week's service is inspired from our fourth decade: 1998-2008. When Canada became the first country to recognize same-sex marriage, we celebrated in Calgary. Our story continued with a newly elected Moderator installed at the US National Cathedral. We yearn to explore ways that everyone feels welcome at the table, with their fullest selves, particularly our transgender siblings. We celebrate our children and teach them to be great leaders. We hope for the day when there are no wars or violence, no one is left on the margin, and terrorism is a thing of the past.

**Sunday, November 4: Faith.** The fifth week's service is inspired from our fifth decade: 2008-2018. We've come this far by faith, believing as we do and coming as we are. In our diversity, we honor and celebrate the queer saints of our movement who dared to dream and came together to build community. We lift up those emerging voices who embody and articulate our faith in new ways and set a course for our next 50 years.
